It is the student's responsibility to communicate with the class teacher as soon as possible about any attendance issues.</li> <li>A student who misses more than 2 classes will not be allowed to take the course test at the end of the academic year and will not receive course credits.</li> <li>Come to classes punctually.</li> <li>If a student arrives less than 15 minutes late three times per semester, it will count as one absence. Arriving to class more than 15 minutes late is counted as an absence.</li> <li>Actively participate in each class.</li> <li>Complete all the assignments by the due date.</li> <li>Pass all written tests and the final written and oral tests at the end of the surverage (arithmetic mean) of the written and oral test grades (grades of 2-5), or a grade of 3 for passing a resit.
